HIGHER EDUCATION IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTE

- It is essential that the file contains the **original** documents (not certified copies), plus two (2) photocopies of these documents. The originals will be returned to the applicant
- Applicants who cannot enclose all documents from the list should consider adding alternatives or explain the reasons for not providing them
- During the examination of the application the Embassy may request additional documents which are not mentioned in below list
- Students may be called for an interview
- Documents issued by local authorities must be legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and afterwards by the Belgian Embassy
- Any documents submitted in languages other than English, French, Dutch or German will not be considered
- Applicants are hereby informed that submission of the below-mentioned documents doesn't guarantee automatic issuance of a visa
- The Embassy shall send an acknowledgement of receipt in accordance with Annex 33b to the Royal Decree
 of 8 October 1981 to applicants who have submitted all the documents listed below. The decision to grant
 or refuse the visa must be taken within 90 days of the date on which the acknowledgement of receipt is
 issued.
- Due to the large number of visa applications to be processed in a few weeks, the Immigration Office
 cannot guarantee that visa applications submitted less than 90 days before the deadline set by the
 issuing institution will be processed before the deadline for final registration.
- An incomplete file will most probably lead to a visa refusal
- Visa fees are non-refundable

• The applicant must present the certificate attesting that he/she does not have a disease that could endanger public health. This document must be issued by a doctor approved by the Embassy within

- The medical certificate drawn up by a non-approved doctor may be accepted if it was drawn up
 within the 6 months preceding the submission of the visa application and if it attests that the
 applicant does not have a disease which could endanger public health. The signature of a nonaccredited doctor must be legalised.

NON-CRIMINAL RECORD CERTIFICATE5 (>18 YEARS OLD)

- A certificate attesting to the lack of any convictions for crimes or offences under common law. This
 certificate must be no older than 6 months from date of issuance and duly legalized
- In case the applicant resided in a foreign country in the 3 months before applying, he/she should
 moreover submit a certificate issued by the relevant authorities of that foreign country, duly legalized
 by the Belgian embassy abroad

- The certificate of enrolment issued by a private institution.
- This certificate is mandatory even in case the applicant intends to take a language course prior to starting the studies. For the language course, a certificate of enrolment is also to be submitted.
- If the training is part of a professional framework: a certificate from the employer explaining the need to follow the chosen studies.

- If the diploma is not yet published when the student applies for a visa, he/she must present a
 certificate of non-publication issued by the competent academic authority, or a certificate of
 achievement issued by the institution attended

- Any degree, certificate or diploma of achievement obtained after the secondary education
- Note: In the case of enrolment in the first cycle of higher education organised by the Wallonia-Brussels Federation, a certificate of equivalence of diploma must also be submitted.
